 - 2 years (6:1)
 - 3 years (8:1)
 - 4 years (12:1)
 - school-age (15:1)
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We will provide care to children from 6 weeks old to the end of 4th grade without regard to race, culture, gender, religion, or disability. We will provide care to children with special needs as long as a safe and supportive environment can be provided for that child.
